Government activities



- Information delivery: on demand or on own initiative
- E-services
- E-decisions (permit)
- E-contract
- Financial transactions
- Interactive communication
- Provide software or hardware for ecommunication





Parties involved



- Government
- Companies
- Citizens
- Providers of infrastructure and communications transfer
- Internet Service Providers
- Third parties
- Other government agencies





Worst-case scenarios (1)



- 1. Inaccurate information in a message
- 2. Violation of integrity of a message
- 3. Violation of confidentiality
- 4. Loss of a message
- 5. Message received twice
- Incorrect time of delivery or sequence of messages
- 7. Delay of delivery
- 8. Delivery at wrong receiver
- 9. Incorrect name of sender





Worst-case scenarios (2)

- 10. Non-repudiation
- 11. Mistakes in TTP-certificate
- 12. Wrong certificate downloaded
- 13. Certificate database not available
- 14. Violation of intellectual property rights
- 15. Slander
- 16. Violation of data protection law
- 17. Violation of Public Records Act (archives)
- 18. Violation of Freedom Of Information Act



Government's legal position



- Liability in tort for indemnity (civil law)
- Contractual liability for indemnity
- Administrative liability for indemnity (administrative law)
- Special liability position for governments:
 - Government must know it's own laws
 - Leaving damage of a wrongful decision for government is more reasonable than for the citizen
 - Balancing of powers
 - Sovernment acts as public/private party?





How to limit liability



- Act in accordance with the law
- Act in compliance with contractual provisions and general obligations for contracting parties
- Formulate obligations of exertion (effort) in your contracts
- Secure your communications processes
- Effect insurances
- Limit or exclude liability?
